
Fresh off making an expansion announcement for his company, a business leader has added to his land holdings in a fast-growing co

WFINV LLC purchased around 141 acres off Honeysuckle Lane in F County for \$3.5 million this month, according to deed records. The lists Bob Luddy, president and founder of CaptiveAire Systems, as a manager in Secretary of State filings.

The land has a Youngsville address and sits about 10 miles southeas manufacturing facility for CaptiveAire Systems, a major manufacturing commercial ventilation systems and products.
